Call for applications for mobility grants reserved to PhD students: non-EU destinations, academic year 2022/2023

Art. 1 – General information

The PhD School of the University of Verona intends to encourage the mobility of its doctoral students, aimed at carrying out study or research activities at foreign institutions located outside the European Union¹. Applicants should be resident in Italy or a country other than the participant's destination country.

PhD students enrolled in PhD courses with administrative headquarters at the University of Verona may apply for funding. The mobility period must be completed and concluded during the regular enrollment period. PhD students who are in receipt of a scholarship and/or grant from the University² or other bodies cannot apply for a grant under this Call for the same mobility.

Mobilities can take place from 1 November 2022 until 31 October 2023, for a minimum duration of one continuous month.

The planned activities must be carried out in the Country of destination: the financial coverage of the mobility will be assigned only for the period physically spent abroad and duly certified by the host institution. Therefore, any mobility periods carried out virtually will not be funded.

Art. 2 – FUNDING

The total budget available will be equal to **140,000 Euros**, of which 90,000 Euros financed by the University of Verona and 50,000 Euros financed by the Italian Ministry of University and Research for the year 2020 (*Fondo per il sostegno dei giovani e per favorire la mobilità degli studenti*).

The amount of the contribution, as required by the Ministerial Decree 989 of 25.10.2019 is established based on the economic condition of the beneficiary: the "ISEE certificate" will be automatically acquired from the INPS database. In the absence of this certification, the contribution will be referred to band 1 (see art. 3).

Art. 3 - GRANT REQUEST

PhD students enrolled in a PhD Programme course will be able to spend a continuous period of not less than one month at a foreign institution (see Art.1) and apply for funding for a maximum of 6 months. The period of stay abroad may in any case be longer than the financed period.

¹ Mobility within the European Union and Countries participating in the Erasmus + Programme (Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Iceland, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, North Macedonia, Malta, Norway, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Czech Republic, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Turkey, Hungary) will be funded through the Erasmus + call for mobility for internships.

² With the exception of the increase in the PhD scholarship provided for mobility periods abroad. Applicants will be allowed to make use of their own research funds for any mobility periods exceeding the financed one.

The grant will be paid to the beneficiaries in the form of a scholarship for post-graduate research activities.

In case of continuation of a mobility already funded under the previous edition of the Call (a.y. 2021/2022), a scholarship may be requested for further 6 months of mobility, calculated on the basis of the monthly amount due starting from the second month of stay.

Art. 4 – APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications will be considered in the order they are received, **starting from 1 October 2022** and until all the available funds have been allocated.

Applications will be accepted **until 1 September 2022**. The mobility periods must be completed by **31 October 2022**.

Completed applications with all the required documents attached should be submitted within a time window ranging from 1 to 3 months before the expected start of the mobility.

The available grants will be allocated in two phases, depending on when the application is received:

- 'Phase 1': the first 70,000 Euros will be awarded to applicants who submitted their applications from 1 October 2022 to 28 February 2023;
- 'Phase 2': the remaining funds will be awarded to applicants who submitted their applications from 1 March 2023 to 1 September 2023.

Should the grants available in the first phase be exhausted before 28 February 2023, it will be necessary to wait for the beginning of 'Phase 2' to submit a new application. If after the end of 'Phase 1' there is still funding available, this will be added to the grants to be awarded in 'Phase 2'.

In accordance with the requirements set out in the present Call, each applicant is required to:

a. find a host institution in agreement with his/her own PhD Course tutor and plan the mobility period;

- b. agree on a research plan with the Host Institution and the PhD Course tutor for the whole mobility period (using the template available online);
- c. complete the <u>online</u> application form attaching:
- the <u>Research plan</u>, duly signed by the applicant, the PhD Course tutor and the supervisor at the Host Institution;
- <u>authorisation letter</u> by the PhD Coordinator to certify that he/she has been granted permission to spend a mobility period abroad.

Candidates may apply for a grant for **only one mobility** under this Call for Applications. Applications with incomplete attachments, or incorrectly filled in or in formats other than those made available online, or not registered by the deadlines specified above **will be rejected**.

Art. 5 – LIST OF SELECTED APPLICANTS, AND PREPARING FOR THE MOBILITY

The PhD Office will promptly check the applications received and draw up a list of the selected applicants who have been awarded a mobility grant, in accordance with the requirements and details set out in this Call for Applications. The list of selected applicants will be made available online.

Grant recipients are advised to contact the Research Office - International Cooperation Support Service (international.cooperation@ateneo.univr.it) for information on the formalities required before departure (e.g. visa application, health and insurance coverage abroad, etc.).

Art. 6 – GRANT PAYMENT

The mobility grants will be paid to recipients in two installments:

- 1. payment of 70% of the assigned grant before departure, once the financial contract has been duly completed and signed;
- 2. balance of the remaining amount due, equal to 30% of the allocated funding, once a final report has been submitted together with a <u>certificate of stay</u> completed and signed by the host institution, according to the guidelines that will be provided to grant recipients.
